Doing territorial research is not only considering what we called *base factors* (morphology, economy, urban planning) but also many other ones, just like *historical documentation* and all factors connected with the *culture* of a place. Lat but not least, we also have to consider the role of *social interaction system*. This research step is probably the one where the distinction between *qualitative* and *quantitative* assumes the highest importance. In particular, it is interesting to study *social interactions* which favour what we called *connective properties*; they can be seen as an opportunity of exchange among *relational, symbolic* and *fruition* contexts.
